This module introduces students to the key facets of P.R.E; critical thinking, intellectual curiosity and empathy which will be fostered, encouraged and celebrated throughout each students academic career at Ravens Wood.</p> <p>Joining up: Understanding the core of philosophical questioning and critical thinking is essential for the sciences and humanities, if not adult life. These skills link to the opening units of German in introducing key vocabulary and new perspectives to students. This is also similar to <i>Ultimate Question's</i> link to the first unit of Music, as students will have a fresh look at what they may consider to already know in order to discover new truth and meaning. Rather than beginning with the finitudes and minutia as Science does with their unit <i>cells and particles</i>, Philosophy, Religion and Ethics begins with a macro approach. This provides our students with the skills to break down big ideas into components of comprehension, perception and reality throughout key stage 3 and later in school and adult life.</p>
