

Subject: Module 5

Overarching Topic:

Who is Joshua?: The object of this unit is to dispel many of the myths around Jesus and have the students consider his religious and social importance. It is inspired by the academic study of the historical Jesus where we look at Jesus as a character from history and attempt to deduce from what is known about him what he would have seen himself as. Furthermore, the key question of whether Jesus should be understood christologically or historically will be posed. Lastly, the students will reflect on their own beliefs in regards to Jesus' existence and his overall message.

Joining up: Ultimate questions will be asked about the truth of Jesus' existence and the morality of his message. Furthermore, the world religions unit will be built upon due to the reliance on knowledge of Christianity and the context of Jesus' leadership. Also, the study of Jesus will underpin the next 4 years of the study of Christianity which has to be 50% of any British PRE curriculum.
