

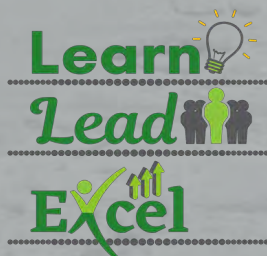

HOW TO SIGN UP:

For many clubs your child will simply sign up with the tutor. Some clubs however, have a selection process and will only be visible on the ParentPay page if your child has been selected. For example, Football will only appear if they have been selected for a Football Squad and the 'Football Subs' payment option will be visible.

Music clubs are free of charge but, for those who have joined an ensemble, we open an item on ParentPay so you can make a donation to support with running costs.

Most other clubs are free. If you are unsure about any club, please speak to the Tutor running the club, or the Head of Department. Alternatively you can contact Mr Freds, Director of Co-Curricular.

All fee paying clubs and activities listed in the Enrichment programme are to be signed up for online using ParentPay (www.parentpay.com). When you sign in you will see a list of clubs and activities. Please note that by default you will only see the first 5 options on your homepage. Click the button 'pay for more items' to see all clubs/items. Fees are payable annually **unless otherwise stated**. If there are any financial issues or difficulties, please email finance@rws.uk.net.

If a club/activity is full it will not be visible on your screen. You can sign up for email and SMS text alerts on ParentPay to be notified when new places/activities are made available.

The Enrichment Programme will commence week beginning 23rd September 2024. Clubs that have a fee and therefore require a payment to secure a space, will go **live on ParentPay on Friday 20th September 2024.**

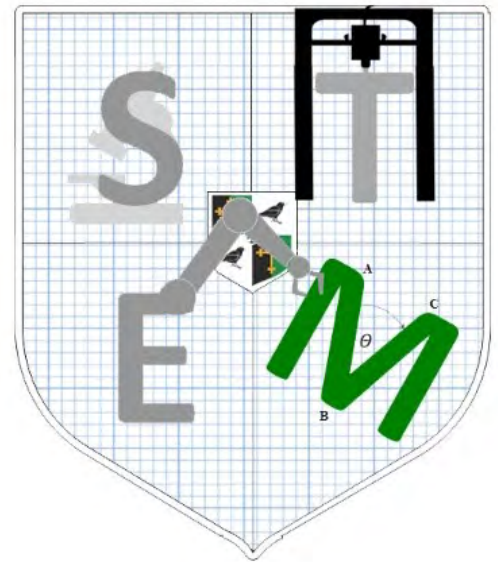
Off-Cut Engineers STEM Club

Open to: **Year 11** and **Year 12** students interested in applying for Medicine, Veterinary Science or Dentistry at University.

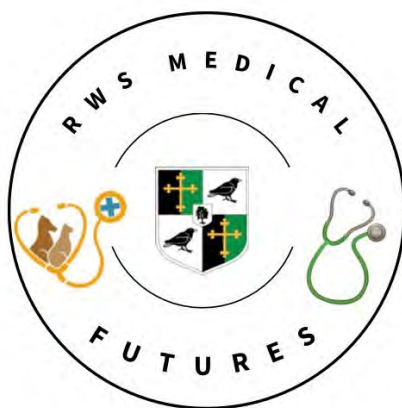

Basketball costs **£30** per year (this covers from September to April).

Summer fees for Cricket, Tennis and Athletics will apply and further details will be released in the Summer Enrichment timetable.

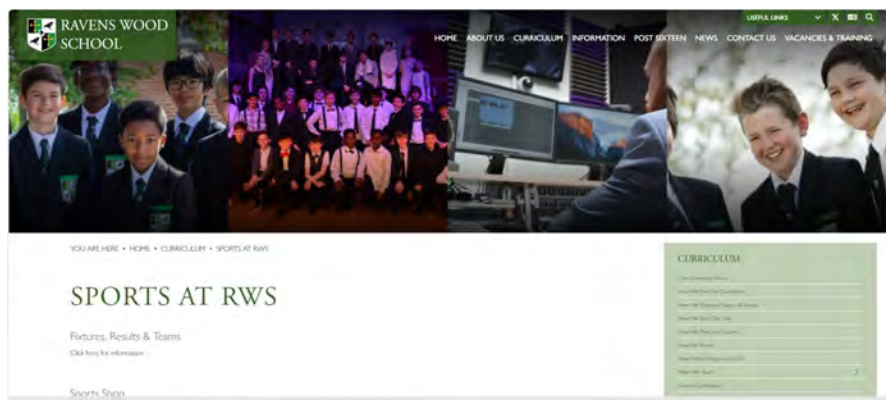
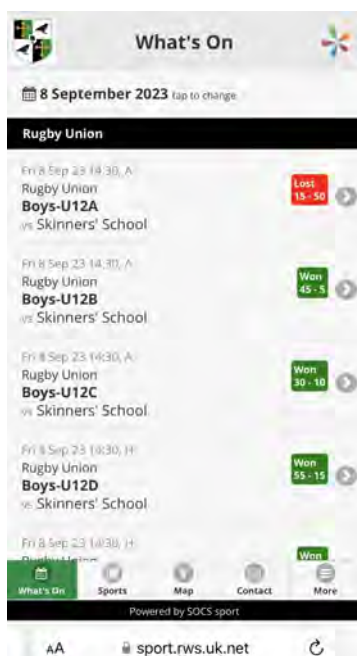

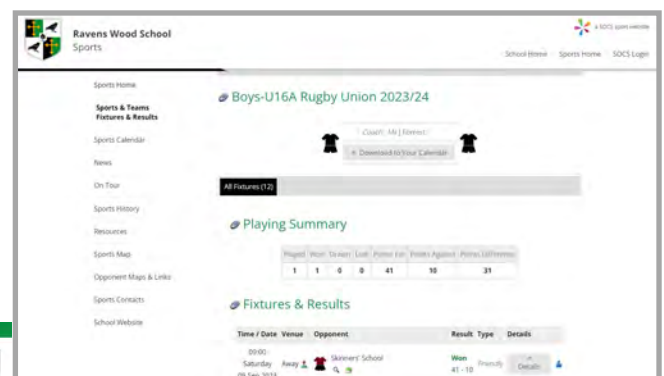

Outdoor Education and Duke of Edinburgh

Outdoor Education and the Duke of Edinburgh at Ravens Wood.

Our outdoor programme at Ravens Wood is designed to allow students to participate in a wide range of experiences in different environments both within the UK and abroad.

Lower school students are offered the outdoor club during Years 7 & 8 where students will be supported to learn a variety of skills, including basic navigation, compass and map work, first aid and self-care in the outdoors. They will also learn fire lighting, basic camp cooking and other bushcraft skills that will build their confidence and instil a love of the outdoors.

As students move through the school, they will have the opportunity to participate in the DofE Award Scheme, starting with the Bronze award in Year 10. They will have the offer of exciting bespoke trips, such as our Arctic expedition to Finland, where we learn cross country skiing, build snow shelters and ice fishing as well as learning Arctic survival from experts.

We are looking for committed students who are determined to carry on when the going gets tough! Good attendance, trust, honesty and reliability are paramount, as you will need to depend on your teammates, and in turn, they will depend on you. Students must bring appropriate clothing/ footwear.

The three levels of the Award – Bronze, Silver and Gold, present increasing levels of responsibility and challenge for all young people, regardless of their background or ability. Each level of the Award has four sections; encouraging participants to learn and develop new skills, improving their physical well-being, giving service to the community and encouraging a spirit of adventure. Further information on how to sign up will be sent out separately to Years 10 -13. This award is regarded highly by prospective employers and can count towards UCAS points.

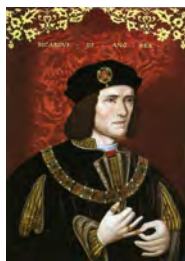

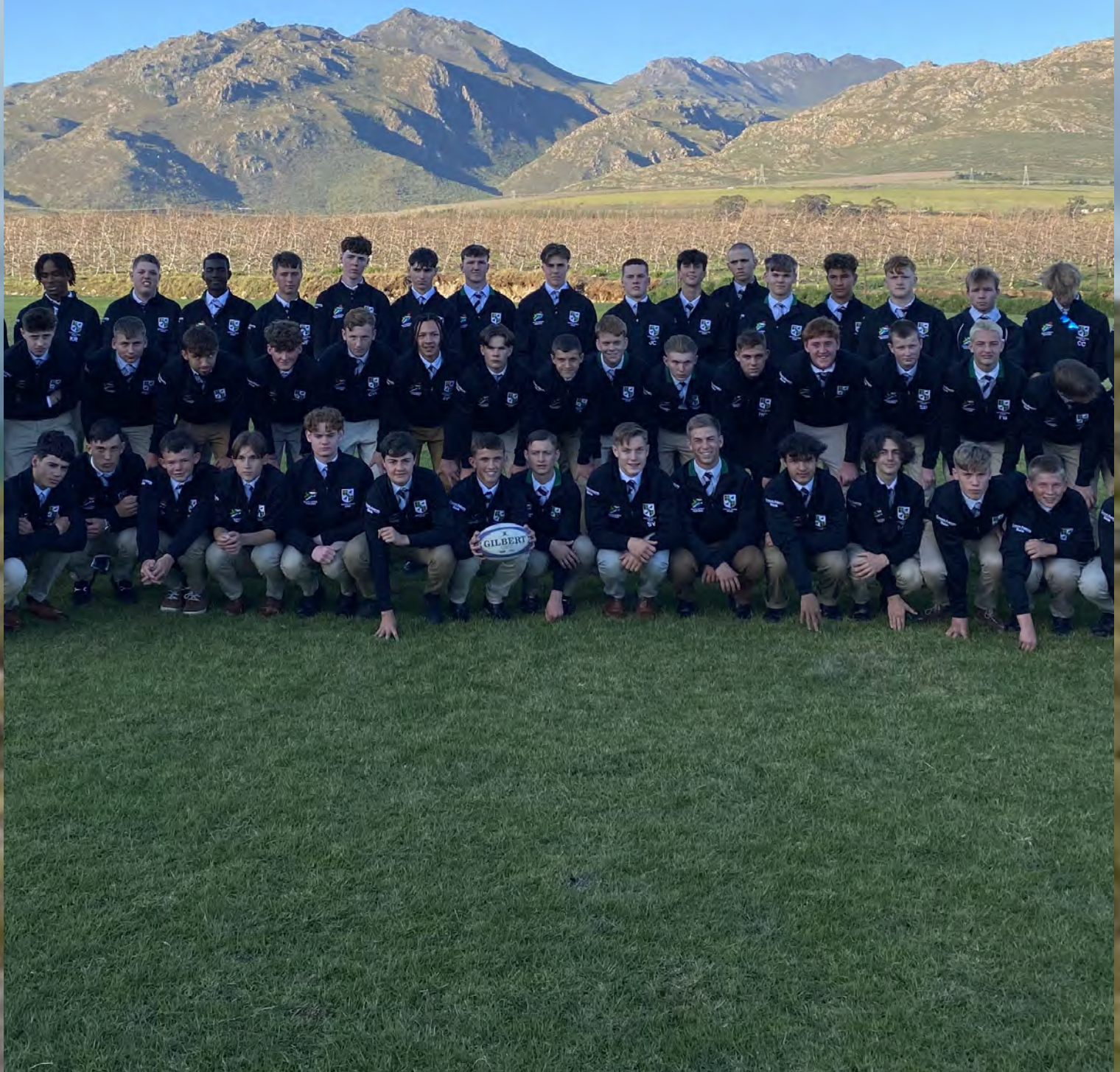
