








Appeal for Equipment for the Quiet Garden

RWS Safeguarding



You will have seen lately in the news that disposable vapes will be banned in the UK as part of plans to tackle the rise in youth vaping and protect children's health. Vaping is the inhaling of an aerosol (mist) created by a vaping device. The health risks include addiction, anxiety and depression, sleep problems, lung damage and exposure to cancer causing chemicals. Other health effects are possible but are unknown due to the current lack of long term research.

Parents, carers and anyone working with children can make sure young people understand the health facts about vaping and know about vaping and the law.

Facts to tell young people about vaping:

- Vaping is a way for adults to stop smoking not something for non-smokers, especially children and young people to try.
- Vaping is substantially less harmful than smoking but that does not mean it is harmless.
- Vaping exposes users to some toxins, and we do not yet know what the risks might be in the longer term.
- Most vapes contain nicotine, which is an addictive substance that can be hard to stop using once you have started.
- Nicotine is more risky for young people than for adults, as evidence suggests the developing brain is more sensitive to its addictive effects.
- In the UK, it is against the law to sell nicotine vaping products to under-18s or for adults to buy them on their behalf.
- Some disposable vapes on sale are illegal and do not meet UK safety regulations. They can contain high levels of harmful substances.

THC vapes contain the chemical that gives the 'high' effect in cannabis. These are illegal in the UK. These vapes can be identified by the colour of the oil which is yellowy brown as well as the smell of cannabis. A small number of vapes have been found to contain dangerous and addictive substances such as 'Spice' and high levels of THC. 'Spice' is a nickname for a substance containing one or more synthetic cannabinoids.


