### **Future's Day**

Year 12 students took part in a 'Futures Day' on Wednesday 17th July. The purpose of the day was to enable students to consider and evaluate their 'next steps' choices and support with their transition into Year 13. All students received a copy of their End of Year Report, which outlined all assessment data from Year 12. This allowed students to review their end of year

assessment results and with the support of their form tutor, complete an academic review and an action plan.

Students also used the Unifrog platform to delve into university destinations, apprenticeship opportunities and the world of work. Unifrog is a careers and destinations online platform which will enable them to access careers and next steps guidance. It will support students in ensuring they choose the right University courses/destinations and/or apprenticeships.

Students were given an insight into the UCAS platform, the stages in completing their UCAS application and support with starting their personal statement. A very productive day and well done to all students for engaging in this day so well. A number of students met with members of the Sixth Form team to discuss end of year data and the support on offer as they move into year 13.














# TRANSITION DAY

universal indicator in an experiment.



# KS3 SCIENCE CHALLENGEDAY



Last week, on Friday 12th July, 16 of our highest achieving Year 8 Scientists represented Ravens Wood at a KS3 Science Challenge day, hosted by Langley Park School for Girls. Four teams from RWS competed against teams from schools within the trust. LPGS, LPSB and Hayes. Firstly, students had to mix sodium thiosulfate with hydrochloric acid to see a colour change. This sounds easy enough, but students had to find the perfect ratio of each reactant that would allow them to see the colour change at precisely one minute. Congratulations to Charlie D, Ali D, Kenan C and Nazar F for being the RWS team closest to 1 minute, with a time of 58 seconds! Secondly, students were given 5 unknown colourless solutions, and had to identify each one as either an indicator, water, a strong acid, a weak acid and an alkali only using reactions between the solutions to do so. Well done to Team A who were the only RWS team to correctly identify all 5 substances!





Scores were added up, ready for the winner to be revealed. All the Ravens Wood teams did fantastically, and worked extremely hard in the challenges. However, a HUGE congratulations goes out to Team A who won the 'Best in School' award for Ravens Wood - well done Zachary A, George M, Leo M and Barnaby W.

We had an excellent day, filled with awesome science activities, and we want to extend a massive thank you to our hosts at LPGS and a congratulations to the LPGS teams for being the overall winners of this year's KS3 Science Challenge.

- Sustainability students are investigating, developing and implementing several initiatives in order to help Ravens Wood School achieve the "Climate Action Award"
- **Charity and Fundraising** students propose, develop and promote ideas to fundraise each half term
  - **Curriculum Support** students are researching and designing wider reading resources to be embedded across all key-stages to support and challenge students in all years.
- **Self Growth** students spend time on self-reflection and growth, identifying tangible opportunities to improve their chances when applying for their next steps choices and helping them stand out from the crowd in competitive application procedures. Students will also complete and submit an essay as part of the RWS1000 Essay Competition.

We are delighted to have celebrated the first place and highly commended entries to our inaugural RWS1000 Essay Competition during our Awards Assembly this morning. All nominated students have been given a copy of the RWS1000 Essay Anthology, which is also in the process of being published on our website.


### GIVE




