

# Sixth Form Application 2025/26 FAQ

#### Please find below a list of frequently asked questions.

# Q: What are the entry requirements for Ravens Wood Sixth Form?

A: To study A Level qualifications, students require a minimum of 5 GCSEs at Grade 5 or above, including Grade 4 or above in Mathematics and Grade 4 or above in English Language and/or Literature. A minimum of a Grade 5 is required at GCSE in the subject students propose to study at A Level.

To study BTEC Vocational qualifications, students require 5 GCSEs at Grade 4 or above, including Grade 4 or above in Mathematics and English Language and/or Literature.

#### Q: How many subjects can I study?

A: Students will be asked to select 3 subjects to study at Ravens Wood, and those wishing to take Further Maths can take it as a 4<sup>th</sup> subject; All courses run as linear, two year A Levels.
